7th Principle tip: While we may not think of ourselves as paper gluttons, Americans consume 681 pounds of paper per person every year (about six 30 year old pine trees). The US paper industry consumes 12,000 square miles of forest per year. In addition, the process that gives paper that 'bright white' look, uses chlorine; its by-product 'Dioxin' is one of the most toxic environmental poisons and has been regularly discharged into rivers by paper making plants. If you'd like to help change this consider making a point of looking for copy paper that is tree free, or contains a high level of recycled 'post consumer waste', or is, best of all, Totally Chlorine Free (TCF). Also look for paper that is FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) certified. While you can actually find 100% recycled paper at Staples for a reasonable price, you might also consider supporting eco-focused on line paper companies such as Greenline and Ecopaper. While you're at it, why not try the competitively priced Bagasse copy paper, made from sugar cane pulp!
